The U.S. Department of Labor and the electrical training ALLIANCE are the grant-funding sources for an Electrical Industry Pre-Apprenticeship Program.

- ✦ 10 Week Program
- ✦ 300 hours of training
- ✦ Introductory and orientation lessons, Algebra and Reading Comprehension, Financial literacy training, Safety training
- ✦ 2 Weeks of On-the-Job Experience



**Weeks 1-7:** 8am-3pm at the NECA-IBEW Electrical Training Center; there will be some homework

**Weeks 8 & 9:** Paid on-the-job training with one of our NECA contractors; work hours will vary

**Week 10:** Evening classes at the NECA-IBEW Electrical Training Center

Successful graduates of the pre-apprenticeship will be granted Direct Entry to the Inside Electrician, Limited Energy Technician, or Limited Residential Electrician Program, provided they meet the minimum requirements of the program.

Classroom training is unpaid. Pre-Apprentices will receive:

- ✦ Stipend totaling \$500, beginning in smaller weekly increments and increasing over the course of the program
- ✦ Pay Period 1 Apprentice wages will be paid during the on-the-job experience
- ✦ Work boot vouchers, school books and tools will be provided to all graduates

### Application Process

- Apply between March 1 and May 22, 2018 5pm:** Submit the Pre-APP Program Application (Form 001) and documentation showing that the Program Requirements as listed above are met

- Interview** with Pre-APP staff or Training Director by scheduled appointment. We will contact you to set this up. We will notify you of your application status by June 25.
- July 9, 2018 8am** Start Date

Acceptance into the Pre-Apprenticeship Program will be determined by several factors:

- Applicant's communication skills
- Application materials, including educational obtainment, letters of recommendation, and work history
- Interview

IF ACCEPTED: The NECA-IBEW Electrical Training Center and employers require substance abuse test and background check. Marijuana use is not permitted in our industry.

Please note:

Dependable transportation is a must for training and employment in the electrical industry. An electrical worker is responsible for reporting to his/her job site, which might be more than 50 miles away, often by 7:00 am. Public transportation is almost never adequate. Given the hours and location of the pre-apprenticeship program's related classroom instruction and on-the-job training, public transportation may fail to get you to and from home to job site, to class and back home.

Geographical area covered: Clatsop, Clackamas, Columbia, Hood River, Multnomah, Sherman, Tillamook, Wasco, Washington Counties, Yamhill County North of Section Line T45, State of Oregon. Clark, Cowlitz, Klickitat, Skamania and Wahkaikum Counties, Washington.
